DOG GROOMING I

(Dog Grooming II is the other half of this CDE)

Effective August 1, 2006

Purpose

The purpose of the Division I Grooming CDE is to teach students the background and basics of grooming dogs. The skills tested in this division should give the student a foundation to build on so that they may become a more skillful and knowledgeable dog groomer.

Date

State: Set annually by the Agricultural Education Service

CDE Rules

1. Each school may enter an unlimited number of dues paid FFA members (novice as participants, the top 2 scores will be considered the one half of the total Dog Grooming Team, the other two scores will come from Dog Grooming II and will be the team score of record.

2. Dog Grooming I members must be first time participants in this CDE

3. A team shall consist of two individuals from the Division I Dog Grooming CDE and two individuals from the Division II Dog Grooming CDE..CDE Format

Each contestant will have two hours to complete the total event, consisting of a written test, an identification test, and a skills practicum.

Written Test (75 points) (online prior to the event)

1. The written test will be 75 multiple choice, matching, and/or true/false questions worth one point each.

2. The test will cover all aspects of dog grooming, but information for test questions will be limited to books, chapters, and/or pages listed in the reference section of these rules.

3. Test questions will be weighted as follows:

15 questions total- Cat Grooming, Oster Booklet, The Art and Business of Professional Grooming, Walin, Dorathy, (see references for chapters)

60 questions total- Maintenance Grooming Workbook, Karla Addington-Smith (see references for chapters) available- afortunatedog@fuse.net

Identification (50 points)
