

***2008 Quick reference for FFA exterior eggs from the “Buckeyeman”  
Class #8 and #9***

1. Checked- any cracked egg
2. Dented check- any cracked egg with inverted dent  
(looks like a spoon tapped into egg shell and dented shell)
3. Leaker- any egg with interior product on shell leaking from a crack inside
4. Slight or moderate stain- any stain than can't be scraped off .....  
smaller than pinky finger end
5. Prominent stain- any stain larger than a thumb print (over  $\frac{3}{4}$  "square" est.)  
...stain can't be scraped off just as in slight stain
6. Decidedly misshapen- any egg that has odd shape especially long skinny or round
7. Large calcium deposit- any calcium that is large and will make egg leak if scraped  
off shell surface (will create a hole in shell)
8. Body check- -any smooth crack that is partially mended and has ring around largest  
part of egg surface
9. Pronounced ridges- defined ridges on shell surface
10. Pronounced thin spots- darkened spots on shell surface that allow for moisture to  
get out easier and appears to be thin structure
11. No defect- none of the above conditions exist

NOTE- In National FFA/State FFA contest faulty soundness/strength should not be used  
(do not practice this defect)
